

The Walnut Grove Title I local educational agency (LEA) has set up the following guidelines to ensure that parents of children being served in the Title I program have an adequate opportunity to participate in the design and implementation of the LEA's Title I project.

1. Parents will be notified, when they pick up their child's achievement test results, that their child has qualified for Title I classes.
2. Parents will be given written notification at the beginning of the school year, or once the student qualifies that their child is participating in a Title I class. Included in this will be information about the Title 1 program, a description and explanation of the curriculum currently being used, description of the forms of assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet. The parents will also receive an interpretation of the school's annual performance report.
3. Teachers will meet with individual parents during the first quarter parent-teacher conference to discuss their child's progress. Teachers will ask for additional conferences as they feel the need. Parents may also request a conference at any time.
4. The teacher will send individual written reports to the parents during the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th quarters.
5. All parents will be invited and urged to attend open house and a planning meeting held in the spring to discuss the Title I program. Suggestions will be solicited from parents for the development and operation of the Title I program at this time.
6. Parents with Limited English Proficiency, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children will have the same opportunity to participate in the Title I program.
7. Parents are allowed to request regular meetings to help in the planning and development of the program. Suggestions will be considered from parents and questions will be answered in a timely manner.
8. The teacher will help provide materials that the parents may use at home (flash cards, math drills, vocabulary lists, reading level books, etc.)
9. Parents and students will be encouraged to participate in educational activities to promote reading and math.
10. Walnut Grove Parents as Teachers program will reach pre-school age children and parents for involvement in appropriate activities.
